## THE BASHKIR HORSE

### THE BASHKIR HORSE

These Curly Muscovites are  
Native to Russia

There is a new breed of saddle horse looming on the horizon which originates in the land of the Cossacks -- deep in the heart of Russia, not Texas. In the State of Bashkir on the western

slope of the Ural Mountains, these horses have been bred and used by the natives -- first the nomads, then the settled people -- for untold generations. The breed is named for the Russian state in which it originated.

The United States Embassy in Moscow sent me several articles on the Bashkir horses, written in Russian, which took many long months to have translated. (The Russian Agriculture Department sent me information on them written in excellent English. I have later information on them also from Russia now being translated by the Library of Congress with the aid of Senator Clair Engle of Red Bluff, California. Senator Engle has

been most helpful in gathering information on this breed of horse from the United States Agriculture and State Departments for me. The foreign editor of the *National Geographic Magazine* has also been very helpful.)

An elderly Russian, who lives in Paradise, Calif., a former cavalry officer in the service of the last czar, came to see my fillies and reported that they are typical of the purebreds of Russia. He said the purebreds are of various shades of chestnut only, with the light manes and tails.

The most astonishing thing about the Bashkir horses in the United States is their remarkable ability to transmit their own special characteristics, conformation, and silky, curly hair through so many generations of outbreeding. In this country they have been called *curly horse* or *fur-covered* horses. The pure Bashkir is truly a very potent breed of horse.

According to information I have received from all sources, these horses were made into a definite breed by crossing the northern Forest Dun with the wild Steppe ponies. They bred two types, saddle and draft. The result has rather narrow heads with straight faces, not Roman nosed. The

mares are very heavy milkers, giving from 4 to 6 gallons of milk in a 24-hour period. The Russians use them as milk cows, as well as to drive and ride. They have very short backs, good shoulders and legs, with small hard black hoofs, even though they may have white legs. Their conformation shows they must have had a shot of the same blood that made the Arabian horse, in the dim beginnings of domestic horse breeding. Their coat is more like silky fur than hair, lying close to the body in tight curls in winter and in loving marcel-like waves in summer. Their mane and tail hair is silky and wavy, but scant.

When they are once caught and subdued, they become very docile and make excellent, easy-riding saddle horses. They have a fast mile-eating easy walk, and having a short back, are able to carry great weights.

They are extremely hardy and able to survive extreme weather conditions, as has been proven on the range in Nevada, where all Bashkir horses in the United States originate. On one range, owned by the Peter Damele family, the Bashkirs were the only range horses to pull through the winter of 1951-52 without being fed. For this reason, and because they are good rustlers on the range, able to survive storms and hunger, they will make ideal saddle stock for northern ranchers who operate in the manner of the Old West and do not pamper their saddle horses. Not that I would advocate that kind of care for *any* horse, but the Bashkir can take it, if it must.

The fourth generation is now coming along since the Damele family of central Nevada started the selective breeding of the Bashkir horses, and they have been sold to all parts of the United States and Canada. Naturally, some have escaped or were stolen long ago, to roam wild through the desert country, and have mixed with inferior horses, which reduced their size. The Damele family has always kept purebred studs of different saddle breeds on their range, so their Bashkirs are well-bred, full-sized horses.

It would be absolutely fascinating to locate the descendants of the first person that imported these Bashkir horses into Nevada in the early days. So far I have not been able to locate any true history of that early importation. The United States Department of Agriculture has no record of such imports, since they only started to keep records of all imported purebred horses in the late 80's.

There is a rumor that the first Bashkirs were brought to Fort Ross in California when the land north of San Francisco was still owned by the Russians. This seems to be the most probable explanation. When they were taken by some early-day settler to Nevada from where they have since been scattered all over the country.

A lady missionary, newly returned from north China, reports that the Bashkir saddle horse is a highly prized possession of the well-to-do Chinese.

They certainly do generate a lot of interest in our locality. Curlycue and La Raine -- our two Muscovite maidens -- were exhibited at the Lassen County Fair at Susanville, Calif., in August and have really built up an interest in the breed. The United States Agriculture Department has advised me that they will give me every assistance possible to get a registry going for the Bashkir horse in the United States, using as a nucleus all of the eligible Bashkirs which can be found in the United States. These will then be bred up as with all new breeds everywhere when the registry books are not closed for several years, giving the breeders a chance to use other blood to improve the conformation of the new breed.

All established breeds of light horses, from the Thoroughbred to the Appaloosa, have had infusions of Arabian blood to improve them and the Bashkirs are potent enough not to lose their own individuality in to process. I believe the Arabian will add speed and stamina to the Bashkir.

Most people prefer to ride a good-looking horse which is dependable and easy-riding, when it is proven to them that the good-looking horse can do anything the jug-headed, low withered, rough-riding horse can do, maybe a little better, and look good while doing it.

We plan to build up our little band of bashkirs by mating our fillies with our young Arabian stallion, Red Raidar, A.H.A.

16017. He is a very refined, classic type of Arabian, with white legs and a blaze face, very light mane and tail, and a bright chestnut color. It is hoped he will put small, lovely heads on the Bashkir foals and give them beauty and stamina, as no other kind of an improver could.

It is hoped, too, that some enterprising horse enthusiast will brave the difficulties of entering Russia and import several, unrelated, purebred Bashkirs of the saddle type to help get our registry off to a flying start.

It was quite by accident that we acquired our first Bashkir filly, Curlycue, and became interested in the breed. In July of 1959, we went over to see our Paiute Indian friends of the Pyramid Lake Reservation perform their tribal dances at the Virginia City Centennial celebration. We stayed at their home in Nixon during this time, driving back and forth to Virginia City with our friends. Having a little spare time one evening, we stopped off at a horse dealer's ranch in Fernley to look over the sale horses. I spotted this blocky-built, curly-haired filly with a mother which showed good bloodlines, although she was old and thin. I could not bear the thought of that fine little filly ending up in a cannery, so we agreed to buy her, along with a true mustang yearling filly.

The mustang filly is making a perfect saddle horse for a small

neighbor boy. We kept the curly-haired filly, as she was so

strange looking. She fought like a bobcat when first roped, but soon became subdued and, within a day or two, was a tame pet.

I had an Arabian mare with a foal about the same age, and she pleasantly surprised me by allowing the new filly to nurse her, so the youngsters took turns for her milk. Curlycue soon learned to eat grain to which I added dried milk and minerals. She did very well and grew like a weed. She had her own little green pasture and had hay and grain in front of her all the time. She never missed her own mother.

She wore the 3D brand on her left thigh, so I contacted the Nevada brand inspector and got the name and address of the breeder of my filly, the Peter Damele and Sons Ranch at Dry Creek, Eureka, Nevada. They were kind enough to give me the history of the Bashkir in Nevada. That started me on the long search for all the data obtainable on the breed.

Late in September we went to the Damele Ranch to see their herd of Bashkir horses. The men had spent several days riding the range to gather them. We witnessed and did help a little in an old-fashioned branding of Bashkir colts. No chutes or fancy squeezes there, they just throw them and tie them and go to work. I chose a nicely built, flashy-marked filly to bring home as a playmate for Curlycue. They

make a matched pair. I named the new one *La Raine*, after Mrs.

Peter Damele, Sr. Even though just off the range, this filly also became very tractable and gentle in a few days. She loaded into the trailer for the long ride home with no trouble.

*La Raine* shows signs of becoming a good jumper, as she would rather jump an obstacle than go around it. She seems to glide so smoothly and effortlessly over quite high feed bunkers.

I think the Bashkir saddle horse has a definite place among the rest of the saddle breeds, especially in the colder climates of our country; although they do very well also on the hot desert, such as central Nevada in summer. They gentle and train so easily, they will be ideal for amateur riders, for all kinds of trail and pleasure riding, as well as being dependable ranch horses. Their long sloping pasterns insure an easy ride. Their short strong backs are built like an Arabian to carry a heavy load over long distances.

I am very proud of my two lovely fillies, the Muscovite maidens, Curlycue and *La Raine*. Their future off-spring, sired by Red Raider, will be the start of my Bashkir program. Red Raider is named for his grandmother, Raida, an imported daughter of the immortal Skowronek. He also carries a strong infusion of Skowronek blood from his sire, Raffscyn, as well as the Antex racing blood.

As the Damele family have always kept good purebred stallions on their range, my future Bashkirs will be very well bred. I am happy too, that my investigation may have clarified the origin of the Curly horses.

(A condensed translation of Russian Department of Ariculture releases)

The *Bashkir* horse is most typical of the horses which, at present, can be found in the southern and eastern parts of Bashkir, A.S.S.R. (Autonomous Soviet Socialistic Republic), but in western and northern parts these horses have been cross-bred with other breeds.

There are two types of Bashkir horses - one in a mountain type, the other is a prairie type. The mountain type is not tall and has a short body. In southern and eastern parts of Bashkir, these horses reach a height of 137 centimeters, and, in northern parts, up to 140 centimeters (12 inches or 3 hands equals about 30 1/2 centimeters). They have a wide and well-developed chest, a thin neck, a small head with a straight profile, and small unexpressive eyes. They have a straight back, although it is not rare to see a humped back in some.

The fillies are known for their milk productivities and will average 10 litres per 24 hours, but some have been known to reach as high as 18 litres (4 to 6 gallons of milk).

In southern parts of Bashkir, the horses are bred with saddle-type horses, and in the northern parts they are bred with work or pack horses. The select Bashkir horses are used for interbreeding to produce the sturdy type that is needed in the mountains or in logging camps.

## Board of Trustee REPORT

I would like to clear the record for the members of the American Bashkir Curly Registry who are, I'm sure, feeling quite uncertain about the future of ABC. Let me say first that the American Bashkir Curly Registry has not disbanded, but is just as strong as ever with very active members whose main concern is our Curlyhorses. The principal place of business is still in White Pine County, Ely, Nevada. Article I, Section 3, of the ABC By-Laws. "The principal place of business shall be at Ely, White Pine County, Nevada; however; in accordance with Nevada State Law, its officers must be residents of any one of the United States of America or its territories. Trustees and members may be world wide."

If you need further clarification, please contact your board members or the Registry office and they will be happy to assist you.

As you are aware, there was some dissent among certain members who, because of misleading information, felt that a recall of our President, Secretary and Registrar was in order. These members took matters into their own hands, without consulting the Board members, and distributed a recall letter to the general membership without the knowledge or consensus of the Board members. This is in direct violation of the ABC By-laws Article III Section 7. "A Member of the Board of Trustees

may be expelled by a majority vote of the Board of Trustees, for im-proper conduct or actions deemed detrimental to the Registry and welfare of the horses."

The dispute arose from the issue that the ABC Registry office had been moved, which would have been a violation of the deed that was signed between Sunny Martin and the ABC Registry. For those of you who are not familiar with that document and its contents, I will summarize; Sunny Martin donated her property, which consisted of her house, a small parcel of land, and some out-buildings. Sunny took out a mortgage for the Registry to build an office which was attached to her house, with the agreement that it would become the headquarters and principal office for the ABC Registry. The Registry would then be responsible to make the yearly payment on the mortgage. Sunny Martin would continue to live at her premises. If the Registry moved or disbanded the property would return to Sunny Martin or her heirs.

Many issues were raised by the recall letter, but none could be substantiated. It became apparent the whole basis for the dispute was the personal conflicts between Sunny and those persons trying to work in the ABC office, i.e., Secretary, Registrar and the Treasurer.

During the recent ABC Convention Robert Eddy, President, appointed a committee to make an effort to resolve the issues

#### DIVISIONS

**FULL CURLY-** consists of any good Curly-Coated Horse with both parents registered with ABC including ABC (straight mares with #374 and under)

**HALF BASHKIR (HB)-** consists of any Curly-Coated Horse with known or unknown parentage, with one or neither parents registered with ABC. Their offspring, if curly, will also be accepted in this division and so on down the line until pedigree shows two generations of ABC registered Curlies in which case that off-spring will be eligible for the ABC (full Curly) division of the Registry.

**STRAIGHT-** consists of any straight horse with both parents registered with ABC. Stallions are not eligible but can be registered with number and certificate pending until gelded in order to keep track of bloodline. Off-spring from ABC straight mares, if curly, will be eligible in the Half Bashkir Division.

**OWNER OR LEASEE** of mare at time of foaling is legal owner of foal, therefore responsible for registering the animal. Lease notification should be sent to the ABC office to be recorded.

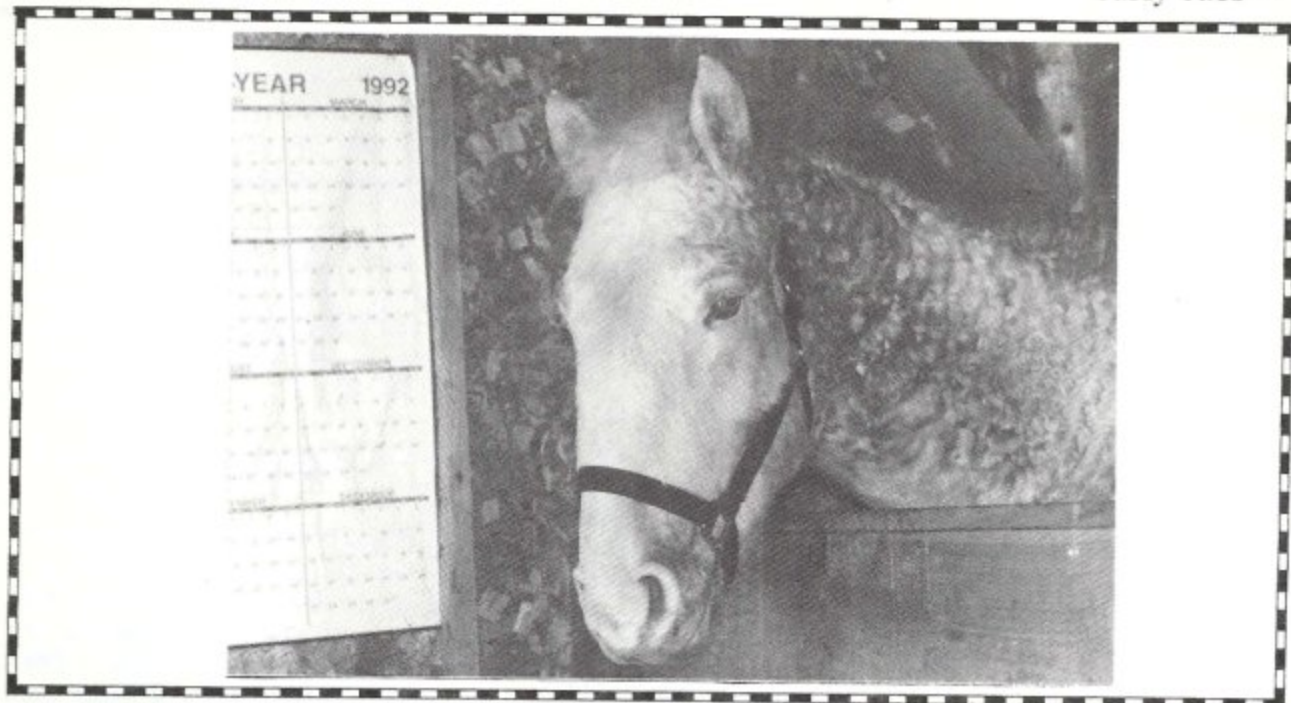

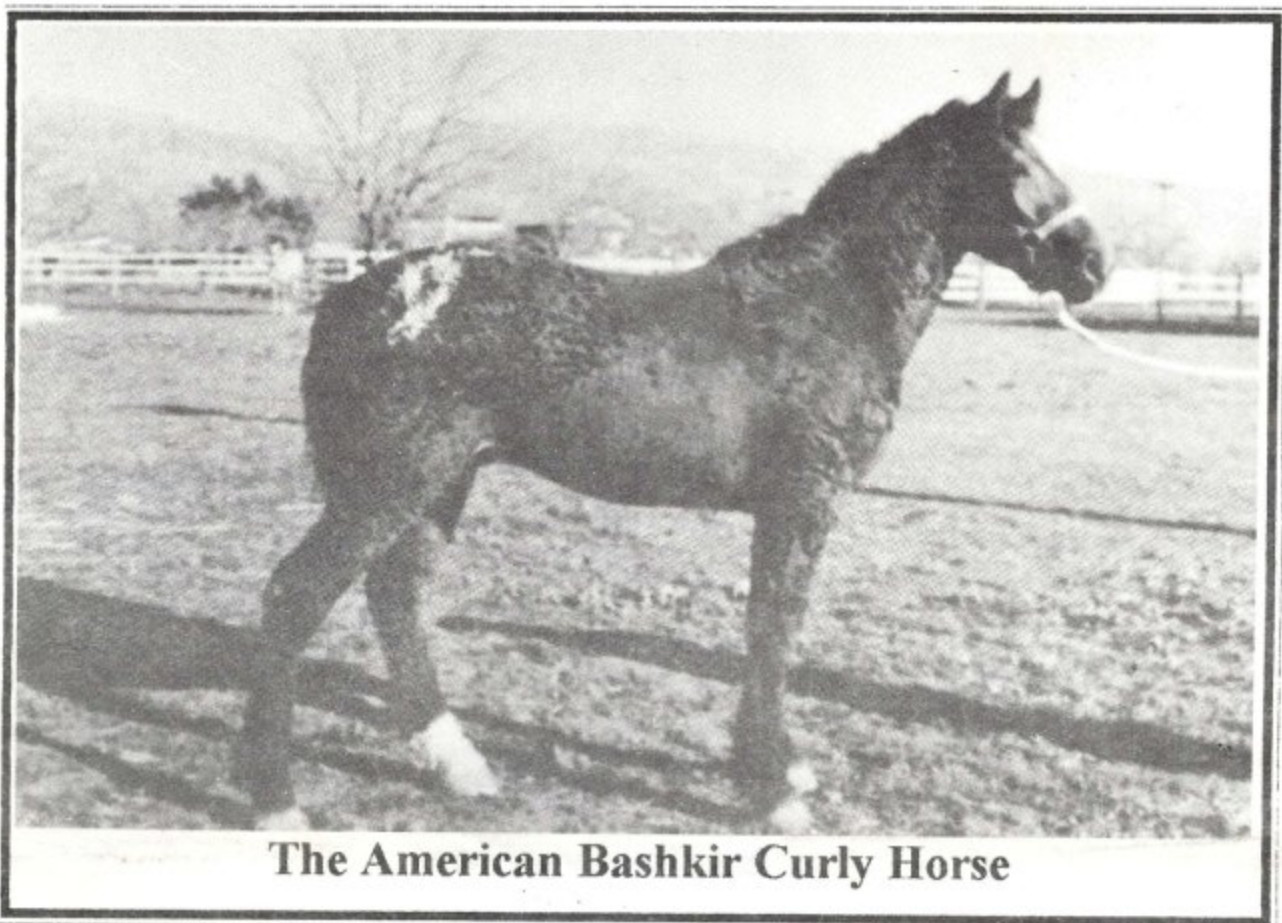
**FROM NEW YORK**
