# Endurance Riding and the Curly Horse

#### **"THE TEVIS CUP"**

The Western States Trail Ride, popularly known as the **Tevis Cup Ride**, is the oldest modern-day endurance ride, having been held annually since 1955. An Auburn businessman by the name of Wendell Robie, a devoted rider of the Sierra high country, organized the first Tevis Cup. The rugged trail from Lake Tahoe to Auburn had to be covered in a day, and there were many doubters. Wendell, with a few of his friends, proved them wrong in August 1955, and continued to hold the event through the Western States Trail Foundation, which helped to preserve the 100-mile trail and the Ride.

A rider who completes the course within the 24-hour limit and whose mount is judged "fit to continue" is awarded the coveted silver Completion Award Buckle. The Tevis Cup Trophy goes to the person who completes the 100-Mile-Day course in the shortest amount of time and whose horse is in sound condition. The Tevis Cup was named for Lloyd Tevis by his grandson Will Tevis, a prominent San Francisco businessman and early benefactor of the Ride, and was first awarded in 1959 to Nike Mansfield, riding Buffalo Bill, an eleven year old TB Cross gelding.

There are two other major trophies involved with this race: the Haggin Cup, named for James Ben Ali Haggin, and the Josephine Stedem Scripps Foundation Cup. The rider whose horse is in the "most superior physical condition" of the first ten horses to cross the finish line is awarded the Haggin Cup trophy. Paige Harper, riding his six-year-old Arabian gelding, Keno, received the very first one in 1964. The Scripps Foundation Cup, established in 1994, is awarded to junior riders for their special achievement. The very first junior finisher was David Jay, Jr., who completed the third annual Ride in 1957.

#### The Trail

The Tevis Cup Ride follows a rugged portion of the Western States Trail, which stretches from Salt Lake City, to Sacramento, California. Beginning at the Robie Equestrian Park, with an elevation of 7,000 feet and south of Truckee, California, the trail descends gradually nine miles to the Truckee River at Midway



Crossing on Highway 89. Taking a route through Squaw Valley, site of the 1960 U.S. Winter Olympics, the ride ascends from the valley floor (elevation 6,200 feet) to Emigrant Pass near Watson's Monument (elevation 8,750 feet), a climb of 2,550 vertical feet in 4 1/2 miles. From the pass, following the trail once used by gold and silver miners during the 1850s and rediscovered by Robert Montgomery Watson in 1929, riders travel west, ascending another 15,540 feet and descending 22,970 feet before reaching the century-old town of Auburn. Much of this historic route passes along narrow mountain trails through remote and rugged wilderness territory. Adequate physical training and preparation for both horses and riders are of the utmost importance. The mountains are unforgiving to the ill-prepared. This Race is the granddaddy of all endurance riding and, if a horse and rider just finish it, they are considered to be among the elite of all endurance riders. That was just a little introduction into what is becoming a very popular sport.

#### AERC

We at High Desert Equine were pleased to be able to attend the AERC (American Endurance Riders Conference), held this year in Reno, Nevada. The turnout was tremendous; we could not believe how popular endurance riding has become. There were many booths, with every kind of tack and supplements, and don't forget the gear for the humans too. In our two days there, we met many people from the area involved in endurance riding and were pleased to hear about a Curly/Arab Cross horse (AM Humvee, aka "Hummer"), from California whose rider loved him for endurance. He is one of the Curly/Arab crosses from Bazy Tankersly's Curly/Arab program.

Famous for her Al-Marah Arabians, she felt that the Curly/Arab cross would produce a superior endurance horse, with more bone. She continued her program until the Registry closed its books to out-crossing in 2000. AM Humvee is receiving an award this year for achieving 3,000 miles. Of course, many of the top finishers in the Tevis Cup are Arabians, but it is nice to see many people interested in Curlies just because of their nature and easy keeping. The 2012 Conference will be in Reno again on the 9th and 10th of March. It will be the 40th anniversary.

This is something that we can use our Curly Horses for, perhaps not such demanding races as the Tevis Cup, but maybe small events that area clubs put on. I am not saying our horses could not do it, just the riders! There are some rides which are 5, 10 or 20 miles long and these would be a great place to start for a beginner endurance rider. What a great way to support local clubs and it would also get you and your horse out for a good ride!

#### **DCC Traveler**

I contacted Liz Mattke who has a Full Registered Curly stallion, DCC Traveler, who does some Endurance riding along with stadium jumping events. Liz sent me a nice article about Traveler that I wish to share with you along with some beautiful pictures.

"I was into Endurance Racing (Arabs) before I was into Curlies", says Liz Mattke. "In fact Endurance Racing could be one of the main reasons I became interested in this amazing breed of horses. "The first Curly Horse I knew was Humvee, the incredible Curly endurance horse, already mentioned in this article. Watching him in the early years got me excited about the prospect of breeding my Arabs to a Curly Stallion to make the ultimate endurance horse. So I started looking at Curly stallions and, shortly afterwards, I walked away with our own Curly stallion, DCC Traveler.

"After one month of saddle training, I hauled him out of the barn and, on his first endurance race, he was calm, competent and handled every obstacle on the trail. That was when I became totally and completely hooked on Curlies. Last year, Traveler and I (below) competed in the first Elbe Hills Endurance Race in Rainer, WA. It turned out to be one of the most technical and difficult endurance races in the Northwest: 38 riders started and 23 riders finished, and I am proud to say Traveler came in 17th with an overall score of A-. He was a trooper.

"Currently, Traveler trains primarily for Three-day Eventing, but we also manage to fit in a couple of endurance races a year. To train for his races, we hit the trails as often as possible, doing a couple of short five-mile jaunts to warm up initially, and then longer loops of 10-20 miles. We vary the terrain: anything with hills and a good climb is a great workout.

We now have three Curly Arabs on the ground: my endurance racing prodigy (and the oldest) is four years. We are so excited about their potential and can hardly wait to start racing them, with Traveler leading the way."

Thanks to Liz Mattke for sharing that wonderful story. Imagine my surprise when she told me she knew about "Hummer". Let's hope one day Liz and Traveler can finish the Tevis Cup. What a great thing that would say about Curly Horses everywhere!

#### **Training and Conditioning**

The practical guidelines for conditioning your horse for your first endurance ride are not suitable for every horse and rider. It is up to you to use your own judgment to determine how to apply conditioning principles to your horse.

The backbone of any program is long, slow, distance work (LSD). LSD teaches the body to use more oxygen, increasing both its ability to carry it to the cells and also to extract it once it gets there. An endurance rider needs to buy a stethoscope and learn how to use it. To take the horse's pulse, put the stethoscope behind and slightly above the left elbow. The resting heart rate for most horses is between 32 and 40. After exercise, the beat will be faster and louder (probably between 72 and 90). How quickly the pulse drops after exercise is the single best indicator of fitness, and this is why endurance riders put such a high priority on keeping track of it. When you first start, don't worry too much about the pulse rate since work will be slow enough not to produce great cardio stress. However, as you progress, pulse recovery will become important. It is good to start from the beginning in checking your horse.

In the first month, go on slow trail rides, five miles or so and at a walk. Substitute trotting for some of the walking periods and increase the distance you ride. By the end of the first month you might be able to go as far as ten miles in two hours. During the second month, you can do more trotting and cantering, paying close attention to how your horse feels. Try making these rides on the trail; field work can get boring and make your horse sour. There are many websites that you can go to for information on the training and conditioning of the endurance horse.

The AERC (American Endurance Ride Conference) was founded in 1972 as a national governing body for long distance riding. There are rules and guidelines developed by AERC that provide standardized formats and veterinary guidelines. The AERC sanctions more than 700 rides nationally and internationally. In 1993, endurance became the fifth discipline under the United States Equestrian Team (U.S.E.T.). Check out their website for more information on the sport of endurance riding (www.aerc.com).

# **Running for the Board of Trustees**

Any adult member in good standing and willing to attend the yearly Conventions may run for Board of Trustees to represent a District. This is a three-year term of office in which the District rep can serve on Registry committees and must attend Board meetings. There will be one member at large and three districts up for election each year. Candidate statements for District 2, 4, 8 and At-Large are presented below.

#### CANDIDATE STATEMENT FOR DISTRICT 2: Penny Johnson

Dear Reader,

This is to announce my candidacy to represent my home district, number 2, on the ABCR Board of Directors. Please let me introduce myself. My husband and I made our living, before retirement, growing almonds as members of the Blue Diamond Co-Op. Ours was a true family farm where my husband, I and our children did all of the farm work to produce and sell a quality almond crop.

I have ridden and trained curly horses since 1989. Because I was favorably impressed by what I saw in the Curly horse, I chose to become a Curly horse breeder, fostering the Damele/Mead line. For the past ten years, I have been developing my breeding program, favoring good disposition and good conformation. Now that we live in Idaho, we grow hay and raise Curly horses. I have come to value good and gentle dispositions in the Curly horse because I am legally blind and need a horse with a very good disposition.

If I am elected to represent District 2, the goals that I will work to put in place are:

1. The ABCR needs to discuss and define a just and reasonable way to introduce new genetic horse blood into its breeding base, as it has been traditionally done until 2000. Many or most of the results of the open stud book were good. One excellent way to reach this goal is to allow BLM Curly mustang blood from horses of good disposition into the ABCR stud books.

2. I want to see the ABCR establish a voluntary breeders' group called the "Pre-Purchase Exam Breeders' Group." This group will require that all horses sold have a pre purchase exam done by a veterinarian agreed upon by both the seller and the buyer. This exam will include health of the horse, conformation, disposition, training level and the veterinarian's general impression of the horse. The results of this exam will be made available, upon request, to any ABCR member in good standing.

3. The ABCR has applied for tax exempt status. As part of this process, the ABCR has stated that if it should dissolve, its records and documents will go to Curly Horse Rescue. If ABCR should disband, its records and documents should go to the International Curly Horse Organization, a respected and established registry. The Curly Horse Rescue is not a registry. Furthermore, I do not believe that it has the competence to safely hold the records of the ABCR.

4. Lastly, I want to have the currant By-Laws and the Rules and Regulations published in the issue of the "Curly Cues" that immediately follows the annual ABCR Convention.

If elected, I will inform all ABCR members in my home district about the discussions held by the Board of Directors. I will also announce what my vote was on all issues.
