Meet a Breeder

NORM DILLS By Marni Malet

Norm Dills......Nevada rancher, mustanger, and breeder of Curly horses. Norm, who celebrated his 84th birthday on August 07, 2004, is still actively breeding horses at his N-D Curly Ranch in Winnemucca, Nevada.

Norm's introduction to Curlies was an accidental encounter in the wild. As a mustanger, Norm periodically rounded up wild herds, culled the old and sickly, and released the others back into the wild. On one such excursion, he and his partner captured a young curly haired stud. Assuming the curls were an indication of illness, they included the stud with the others being culled. Norm didn't give it any more thought. A few months later, his partner showed him a copy of *Western Horseman*. There was an article about Curly horses, and a picture of the very stud they had captured! It seems that someone had purchased him, and he now had a price tag of \$2000!

At that time Norm, was raising Quarter Horses. His band of broodmares ran on open range, with his Quarter Horse stud, King Bob. Norm, concerned about the old stud's health, asked the BLM agent to keep an eye out for him. Norm's concern was validated when the BLM agent reported finding him down and having to shoot him.

Norm's Quarter Horse foals were in high demand, but he wasn't sure if King Bob had covered all the mares before he died. There was always the possibility that another stud had taken control of the herd. The following spring told the story—two of the mares dropped curly coated foals. One of his best customers, hearing about Norm's crop of Curlies, told him about Sunny Martin and her interest in the Curly horses. Norm went home and gave her a call.

That was the beginning of Norm's Curly herd. Sunny and Benny Damele's enthusiasm for the breed was infectious. Norm and Benny became close friends, and Norm helped Benny round up his weanlings every fall for the annual Curly sale at Dry Creek Ranch. Norm was active in the ABCR and served as it's fifth presi-

Norm was active in the ABCR and served as it's fifth president, from 1983 to 1989. Norm laughingly remembers spending a lot of time in Carson City trying to settle lawsuits filed against the registry as a result of Sunny's "discretion" when registering horses.

Norm was good friends with the Hollywood movie star Monty Montana. Using that connection, and Sunny's two-year letter-writing campaign, they were able to get a spot for the ABCR Curly horses in the Pasadena Rose Parade. Norm rode in the Rose Parade for eleven years, always mounted on his stud Curly Clown, ABC-145.

Norm remembers Curly Clown as one of those special horses that comes along once in a lifetime. "He was the one that I really bonded with. I could chase cattle 9 days straight, 50 to 60 miles a day, on that stud. Other cowboys, riding Quarter Horses, would change horses about every other day. Their horses would come in with their heads draggin', but not Curly Clown. He'd come in with his head up and ears perked. I used to haul him in the back of my pickup truck—I

didn't even bother putting racks on it! I could load Curly Clown into anything."

When the registry decided to look into genetic research, Norm mentioned the project to his son-in-law, Mike, an instruc tor at the University of California Davis who worked with Dr. Ann Bowling. Dr. Bowling expressed interest in taking on the project and called Sunny Martin. Unfortunately, Dr. Bowling passed away before completing the research, but others at Davis are continuing with her work.

Norm found, as did the other early Curly breeders, that they had to crossbreed to prevent inbreeding. Norm chose to cross with Appaloosas, as he felt the two breeds are related. He crossed his Curlies with the Top Quest Appys, known for producing top reining horses. He claims that crossing a Curly with an Appy will always produce curl. Since he was an employee of BLM, he had first dibs on the horses that were brought in. At one time, he had 42 mares and 10 studs.

In an effort to allow himself more leisure time, Norm has downsized his Curly herd to three broodmares and five studs, though he admits he doesn't need five studs to cover three mares and says he will probably cut some of the boys. Norm might want to slow down a bit, but I don't see him ever leaving the world of Curlies.

ABCR has been privileged to enjoy the leadership, support, and friendship that Norm has offered over the years.

ABCR CURLY HORSE BREED STANDARDS

Body Conformation

-A medium size head with well-defined jaw and throatlatch

-Wide set eyes with eyelashes that curl up

-Ears that are short to medium in length with curls inside (ear hair does not totally shed out in the summer)

-A medium length neck, deep at the base of the neck where it joins the base of the shoulder

-Noticeably short back, deep through the girth

-An appearance of a long under line and the belly cut high in the flank

-Heavy boned legs and short cannon bone as compared to the forearm

-Medium withers and a flat croup with a shallow slope to the base of the tail

Curly Characteristics

Body (Fine, soft hair)

-Ringlet (can be several inches long)

-Marcel Wave (deep soft wave in the body coat)

-Crushed Velvet (soft dense pile of curls in body coat)

Mane (Extra fine hair)

-Kinky –preierable

-Wavy

-Should shed all or partial in the summer

-Split mane (hangs on both sides of neck)





Tail

- -Ringlets
- -Wavy

-Should shed partial at the head of the tail in the summer of some horses may shed tail completely

Fetlocks

-Curly –preferable

-Wavy

-Should shed in summer but still retain some long hairs

Hooves

-Almost perfectly round in shape

-Very hard and dense

-Proportioned to the size of the horse

Size and Weight

-Average-15 hands

-Average weight-800 to 1000 pounds

Unique Characteristics

-Curly coat can be hypoallergenic (the horsehair is round instead of flat and testing has shown the hair is closely related to mohair)

-Noticeably short, strong back

-Even-tempered disposition

-Quick pulse and respiration recovery

-Very dense bone in the legs

ABCR CURLY HORSE DATABASE

ABCR provides a fully linked ABCR Curly Horse Studbook ONLINE with more than 8,100 entries and 2,950 pictures including all ABCR horses. These are the features of this database:

- 1. Fully linked PEDIGREES WITH PICTURES
- 2. SIBLINGS VIEW: Find full and half siblings of a given ABCR animal at-a-glance
- 3. OFFSPRING VIEW
- 4. VERTICAL PEDIGREES: Vertical pedigrees list full siblings of each horse in the pedigree at-a-glance, which as a group represent various combinations of their parents' genes, and are good indicators of the range of possibilities that are likely to be passed on. Using vertical pedigree analysis gives breeders interesting insights e.g. about confirmation or the extreme characteristics that cannot be tracked in a direct manner.
